PRESIDENT'S REPORT

2007-08 has turned out to be a season of extremes with fire and rain dominating our summer season. Unfortunately, these did not occur at the same time, and we subsequently lost several weekends of games and many many hours of time dealing with the repeated attempts by vandals to burn down the canteen.

By contrast, what happened on the diamonds was truly special. Having fun is not normally associated with the role of Club President, but that is how I look back at this past year.

From the first Try Baseball day through to the Junior and Seniors Grand Finals, it has been a tremendous season. As always, the smiles, laughter and giggling are very contagious. Once the parents and coaches stopped doing this, the kids started having fun too!!!

We certainly achieved success in terms of winning 5 Championships, but it was very fulfilling to see so many returned players, both in the Junior and Senior ranks.

We have begun to even more closely analyze our player movements and retentions and will continue to develop our strategies by what we glean from this.

This year saw the start of Little League for under 11's and under 12's in the Hills Association and the NSW Junior landscape. The longer-term implications of this are not fully understood, and some decisions being made by those on high at the AABF and NSWBL are quite baffling. Nevertheless, we have committed to participate and we will continue to do so in the Carlo Spirit. There will be flow on effects to other age groups including rules, dispensation requirements and cut off dates. These will be ironed out over the off season but we do expect one or two loose ends to still be around at the beginning of the Summer season. Hopefully, most of these will be one off adjustments as we make the switch to the Little League age groups, and should settle down after that. Nevertheless, we have real concerns that some of these changes will affect registration to some extent. We will try to keep our members informed of these changes and to try to communicate with them as much as possible during the transition period.

Within a club like ours, the most important and demanding position is the Juniors Co-ordinator. Stressful, thankless, and constantly juggling teams and players, Carol Barton has been terrific this year, as always. Our growth and success can be put down to Carol's determination and commitment to creating the right environment for juniors to play in. Friendship, Fun and Learning skills are the pillars Carol has built the Junior Club on and the results have been evident in our success, growth and retention of players. Without juniors, we will not have seniors, and the longer we can keep our junior players in the club, the greater the chance of transferring them over to the senior ranks. From here, the cycle starts again. Well done Carol.

A special thank you to Brad Clark who was thrown in as Seniors Co-ordinator at the beginning of the Summer season. As an ex Carlingford junior Brad has a special passion for the Club and it was unbelievably rewarding to see Brad and Russell Briggs lead a team of recently ex juniors to compete in and win the E Grade Seniors competition. I was always personally gutted when I heard of ex Carlo Juniors joining other clubs because we could not offer them a competitive standard team to play in. This was the highest graded Senior team we have had for some years, and it augers well for the future of the club and the players.

I need to make a special mention of Robyn and Steve Gosper and their contribution during the several attempts by vandals to burn down the canteen/amenities block over the summer. It is hard to describe what the canteen, equipment and our stock of uniforms look and smell like after the smoke, soot and flames have been through them. Nevertheless, their sleeves were rolled up

and the clean up was completed. Unfortunately, no sooner was it cleaned up, when another fire would result in us having to do through the whole process again. Robyn's patience was stretched to the limit by the council contractors choosing to wash the canteen walls with high pressure water spray, and sending all the water and black muck back inside the canteen Robyn had just cleaned the day before. Truly, a magnificent effort, thank you Robyn and Steve

A major project which commenced this year was the redevelopment of Muirfield High School's baseball diamond. In co-operation with the school, we have been able to complete significant drainage work, level out the infield and improve the spectator facilities around the back of the diamond. The school has also come to the party with a 50/50 contribution to the costs on the work and a long term lease on the ground. Thank you to Mr Steve Billington, Principal at Muirfield for his co-operation and commitment to our club. Also, a big thank you to our Club's Vice President, Ross O'Shannassy for negotiating the above with the school, and for the efforts of Dave Aiston and Graeme Hall in making it happen.

A very special thank you and goodbye to Dave Aiston. Dave has been our Groundsman and Equipment officer for several years and had contributed above and beyond anyone's measure what would have been expected. Thankfully, Dave won't be leaving us entirely and he will be around to give advice when needed (whether we want to hear it or not). Dave's passion and enthusiasm has been infectious and the state of our grounds reflect his blood, sweat and occasional tears. We are lucky to have such a terrific ground and have been even luckier to have Dave to look after it. Thanks for everything Dave!.

On a final note, it is always pleasing to hear of ex Carlo kids doing well. It was terrific to hear that Adam Spencer, a Carlingford Junior for almost 10 years and most recently a member of Bauklham Hill's u18's Major League team, has been signed by the legendary Chicago Cubs. Matthew and Wendy Spencer (Adam's parents) were themselves long time members of the Carlingford Baseball Club committee. Adam will leave for the US in early 2009 after he finishes his HSC. We wish him every success in the future.

In conclusion, I would like to thank those people who, even though they were not on the committee, still contributed throughout the year. These were the people who umpired games, kept score, did their canteen duty, base coached, or just helped out at training. Thank you, you are the mortar that binds the club together.

TREASURER'S REPORT

It is with pleasure the Treasurer's report for the 2007 / 2008 baseball season is presented at this AGM. The Club has again finished the year in a sound financial position whilst accomplishing the goals set by the committee at the start of the year.

Despite the ongoing increase in affiliation fees to NSW Baseball, the committee, mindful of providing affordable membership, was able to maintain membership fees for both junior and senior members at close to last year's rates.

Income and Expenditure

The Club finished the year with an operating deficit of \$4,780.30 against a surplus of \$2,089.22 the previous year.

Gross Income of \$49,899.03 exceeded the previous year by \$8,500.00 or 20%. In line with previous years, most income was generated through junior and senior registrations (\$35,364 or 70%); canteen takings (\$7,620.77 or 15%); and uniform sales (\$4,784.00 or 10%). The remaining 4% was generated from sponsorship, interest and miscellaneous fund raising activities.

Funds in term deposit were increased to \$22,379.56, an increase of \$8,103 over the previous year with non-interest bearing cash at bank maintained at approx \$11,000.00.

The canteen continued its valuable contribution to Club funds with a slight increase in takings to \$7,620.77. Whilst the canteen continued to rely on the goodwill and voluntary effort of club members, a part-time, paid staffer was appointed to manage the canteen Saturday mornings. This contributed to the efficient running of the canteen and will be endorsed for the 2008 / 09 season.

Uniform sales at \$4,784.00 were only marginally up on the previous year.

Expenditure for 2007/08 year exceeded that for 2006/07 by \$15,378.14. Most of this increase was attributable to clothing and uniforms at \$14,374.73 up by \$9,835; canteen at \$5,818 up by \$687; ground expenses at \$6,798 up by \$1,749; equipment at \$5,781 up by \$1,713; advertising at \$1,992 up by \$1,669; and affiliation fees at \$12,293 up by \$2,331.

Supporter shirts were purchased by the Club and provided on a complimentary basis to team coaches, managers and committee members for the season in order to present a more unified look and promote the Club at all functions and venues. It is not expected the same level of expense will be repeated next season.

The Club is very grateful to Muirfield High School for allowing senior and junior games to be held on their sporting fields during the summer season. In recognition of this, Club Committee members and parents worked tirelessly over Christmas to improve the drainage and surface at Muirfield in order to make the grounds safer and better for players. This accounted for most of the increase in grounds expenditure. Again, it is not expected this expense will be repeated next season. The Club has signed an agreement with Muirfield for continued use of the fields for the next 5 years, so this work and expense should be viewed as an investment in future years.

The largest Sundry item was the Christmas party, at approx \$1,500. Other items included the Club's subsidy of several players selected to tour Japan and the USA as representatives of both the Carlingford Baseball Club and the Hills Association.

Refunds of \$1,350 were also made during the season which was not shown as a separate item for the previous year.

Assets and Liabilities

The Club has no material liabilities.

Assets include cash at bank and funds in term deposit, along with uniforms, club clothing, equipment, balls, bats, kits, helmets, catching and umpiring gear plus canteen hardware. As many of these items have a life expectancy of less than 3 years, it is of little benefit to try to accurately calculate the next asset position of the club.

Audited Accounts

Please note, these financial statements were not audited at the time of presentation at the AGM due to a shortage of time between the Club's end of financial year being March 31 and the AGM April 5. These accounts will be audited however, and will be done in accordance with the Club's constitution.

REGISTRAR'S REPORT

Registrations for the 2007-2008 Season were significantly increased over those of last year. Carlingford was able to field three extra Junior teams but fielded one less Senior team. Comparative numbers for Carlingford for this season and last were:

As can be seen, the U7 and U8 age groups were increased (allowing a total of 4 teams to be fielded). The U10 age group was significantly increased (175%) allowing a total of 3 teams to be fielded. Both these increases are largely due to the success of the Try Baseball days. It was also great to see an increase in the U12 and U14 age groups – which typically decrease as children move on to high schools and become involved in other activities.

In the Seniors competition, total numbers were up slightly on last year. Carlingford was able to field an E Grade team consisting of several recent retirees from the Junior ranks.

Across the Hills Association the total number of teams was increased by one, compared to last year. This continues an upward trend at the association level that has been underway for a number of years. The strongest growth was seen in the U8, U10 and U14 age groups. Unfortunately, there was also a significant drop in U17 teams – counteracting the significant increase last year. The numbers of teams in each junior age group in Hills, compared to the previous two seasons, were as follows:

However, there is still the ongoing challenge of retaining existing players, especially as they move into high school, as well as out of the Junior age groups.
